Are you in Good Hands?

Taking a car to a new repair shop is an exercise in trust. Unfortunately Brothers, not all car mechanics are as honest as they should be. Learn the signs of a dishonest car shop and avoid getting scammed when go in for repairs.

To help you weed out the good from the bad, a list of things to look out for when you take your car in for repairs. If your mechanic starts raising any of these red flags, it's probably time for a second opinion.

1. Watch for the Scare Factor. When a mechanic says things like "I wouldn't drive this car another mile" or employs other scare tactics to discourage you from leaving the lot, it's probably a good idea to do just that.

- 2. Look for Certifications. ASE certification or seals of certification from ASA, AAA and other auto industry groups should be prominently displayed in a reputable shop.
- 3. Question, Question, Question! Ask how long they've been in business. Ask for alternate recommendations. Ask about the equipment.
- 4. Get It In Writing. Never sign a blank work authorization form. Always get a written estimate before you put your mechanic to work. And don't forget

to ask about warranties! Any decent mechanic should guarantee his work.

- 5. Ask for Your Old Parts Back. This seems frivolous, but getting back your old parts will ensure that they were indeed replaced—and in need of replacement in the first place.
- 6. Don't Do Double Labor. If a mechanic is going to charge two labor costs, ask how long the total job will take. Some will charge you double labor even though they can essentially perform both tasks at the same time.
- 7. Do Your Homework. Shop around. Get a second opinion.

2012 Vote: Get Involved

Kappa Alpha 4 Part Series on the upcoming 2012 Elections by: Brother JT Richardson

Are you aware that.....

It is unlawful for any person, on election day, to distribute any type of campaign literature or place any political posters within 200 feet of any entrance used by voters to enter a polling place. This includes voters wearing campaign paraphilia to the voting precinct. This means that you should not show up to the voting precinct wearing a candidate's pin, hat, and or a shirt. You will not be permitted to vote.

It **is** permissible for a candidate to be stationed outside the polling place but within the 200 feet barrier to greet voters and solicit votes, provided there no complaints from voters. A candidate may wear a badge no larger than 4 ½" X 4 ½" within 200 feet of the entrance to the polling place.

This label may contain the candidate's name and office sought. The candidate may enter the polling place but this badge must be removed before entering.

A candidate may greet voters in line or out of the polling place as long as he/she is not intimidating voters or interfering with the orderly election process. A candidate may not actively campaign inside the polling place.

It is also permissible for the representative(s) of a candidate to be stationed outside the polling place but within the 200 feet barrier to greet voters and solicit votes, provided there no com-



plaints from voters. Representatives of candidates <u>may not</u> wear any type of badge within this 200 foot area. Representatives of candidates may not display or distribute campaign literature within this 200 foot area.
