Rock Hill, SC -The Blackmon Road community, located just outside of the Rock Hill city limits, is one of the poorest communities in the entire state of South Carolina. Many residents there live in third

world conditions. They live without necessities such as: plumbing for bathrooms or without trash pick -up, without paved roads. In the past this community was known as "T*rash Pile Road*" and in any change has taken place. On Saturday June 2nd, 2012, the Kappa Alpha Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., began its initial phase of working in the Blackmon Road community in Rock Hill, SC. A Place for Hope is an agency located in the Blackmon Road community working to help to poverty stricken area. The center serves as a day care facility and a place for citizens to come and request government assistance.

During the February chapter meeting, Brothers discussed and agreed to make a concerted effort on making a difference in the Blackmon Road community.

Are you in Good Hands?

Summer is supposed to be a time of celebration for teens and their families, with prom, graduation and college on the horizon. Unfortunately, new analysis of crash data from the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety shows that July 4 is the deadliest day for teens on the road; and is just as deadly for the motorists that will be driving alongside them.

In the U.S., car crashes are the number one cause of death for everyone ages 1-34, with teens crashing four times more often than any other age group. Based on the latest available data, IIHS reports that more than 800 people were killed on July 4 from 2006-2010. And if the projections remain true this year, an average of 140 people will lose their lives on July 4 due to car crashes.

"These tragedies are compounded by the fact that many crashes are preventable," stated Victoria Dinges, vice president of public social responsibility at Allstate. "Driver error, speeding and distractions are the main causes of crashes. Simple activities such as switching radio stations or interacting with friends can significantly impair a teen's or adult's ability to react quickly to changing traffic conditions. Staying focused on the road, wearing seat belts and following the speed limit and other road rules are simple steps we can all take this July 4 to make sure we return home safely."

Thoughts for Your Future

In these next 2 editions we will learn the basic of stock 101.

A ticker symbols is a sort of identification tag for a stock. It is comparable to a person's social security number. For instance, if you wanted to find information on Coca-Cola, you could go to a page such as Yahoo Finance and enter "KO" into the symbol box. After pressing the submit button, the site will bring up all the information you need on the Coca-Cola company. The ticker symbol is used mostly for placing orders with brokers and looking up information on particular company / stock.

You can tell which exchange a stock trades on based on the number of letters in its ticker symbol. Stocks with four or more letters, for example, trade on the NASDAQ.

Stock - Ownership of a corporation indicated by shares, which represent a piece of the corporation's assets and earnings.

Shareholder - Person or entity that owns shares or equity in a corporation

A **stock split** is essentially when a company increases the number of shares. For exam-



ple, if you owned 25 shares of XYZ at \$15 per share, and there was a 2-1 stock split, you would then own 50 shares worth \$7.50 each.

The **Dow Jones Industrial Average** (DJIA) is an index of thirty, blue chip stocks that are traded in the United States. It is believed that by looking at the companies on the list, a person can get a general picture of how the market as a whole is performing. The Dow is perhaps the most quoted and followed index in the world, and dates back to May 26, 1896. It was then comprised of 12 stocks and opened at 40.94.

The NASDAQ is an electronic exchange where stocks are traded through an automated network. It stands for National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations System. As a general rule of thumb, it is where most technology stocks are traded. A quick way to tell if a company is listed on the NASDAQ is to check out the ticker symbol... those made up of four letters are listed here (e.g. Microsoft = MSFT, Dell Computers = DELL, Cisco = CSCO).

The Standard and Poors

500 (S&P 500) is an index made up of five hundred different stocks. Each is selected for liquidity, size, and industry. The index is weighted for market capitalization. The S&P 500 is the benchmark of the overall market, and frequently used as the standard of comparison in terms of investment performance.
